

How Are Our Past Students Doing?

Many of you have asked me in the past about how our former students are doing in ministry since graduating from Mapepe Bible College. Just recently, I asked Don Boyd (who is a missionary working in a new mission work among the Kaonde in NW Zambia) to write up a brief evaluation of one of our graduates from last year, Aaron Chilembe. Aaron is 62 years old and is our oldest graduate to date. Here is the evaluation that Bro. Boyd wrote to me:

Aaron Chilembe has been a great asset to the Lord's church here in the Northwest Province. He has dedicated himself to work with several of our new church plants and has worked diligently while helping plant two new congregations at Kayonge and Lunsala. His latest efforts have been to begin a new preaching point at Muyashi. He is a natural for this work as he has many contacts through family and friends here in Chief Mumena's area. He is a real servant of the Lord as he preaches and teaches to help spread the gospel in our community. As a farmer and carpenter Aaron neither receives and expects no payment for this work.

Mapepe Bible College has also played a key role in spreading the gospel here in Northwest province. The training Aaron received during his two years at Mapepe has more than equipped him for this work. He has adequate knowledge of the scriptures and is capable of doing valuable research. Aaron's training has given us incentive to seek for other candidates to attend Mapepe.
